Minutes

The Committee opened by approving amendments to the minutes of the September 2018 meeting.

Public Comment:

Members of the public expressed concerns about public opinion regarding the recent SAFE levy, along with concerns about amounts devoted to multimodal transportation during the ongoing budget process.

Agenda Items:

City Manager Morgan Smith provided a summary of transportation items in the CIP, which currently weighs transportation investments toward the years 2021-24, with fewer investments in 2019-20. Manager Smith explained that this discrepancy is driven largely by the timing of grant funds. Attendees discussed ways to increase funding for multi-model transportation projects in the ongoing budgeting process.

Engineer Report:

- Chris Hammer provide updates on the Olympic Drive Project, is nearly ready for bid. The City has completed negotiations with adjacent landowners regarding easements for construction access. Construction should begin in early 2019.
- The City is currently paving shoulders on the Core 40 shoulder improvement project on Miller and Fletcher Bay Road. The project should be done within the next few weeks.
- City Staff held a public meeting regarding a proposed intersection improvement at Sportsman Club & New Brooklyn Road on October 18. The City has developed a visualization regarding the roundabout proposed for this intersection, which received input from committee members.
- Several committee members met with WSDOT staff involved in the SR 305 Corridor Improvement study to discuss multi-modal components of the study.

Agenda Items:

- The Committee discussed responses to election results regarding the City's SAFE Mobility Levy. Committee members and attendees discussed a variety of ways to respond to concerns raised by members of the public.
