

## NMTAC Meeting April 8, 2015

### Meeting Minutes

- Since there was no quorum, there was no call to order.
- Public Comment: Equestrian concerns; members of the Bainbridge Island Saddle Club reported that new signage not effective at slowing traffic, especially at entrance to Manzanita Park and two other places. Maureen & Jenny. Drivers are not aware of how to safely pass horses & tend to treat them like bicyclists. Day Road to the Saddle Club property is a particularly problematic area, with cars traveling at high speed.
- Resident from Vineyard Lane stated he was here to listen and is concerned about STO and John Nelson Trail.
- Chris presented info on a road diet session he will be taking part in, info on BI Volunteer Week Celebration, and ideas from the retreat. The possibility of a STO Expeditionary Trail that could be developed sooner than the main STO Trail, using an old city right of way, and Rob Grant said he is planning to walk the trail soon to clarify right of way issues between Lovgren and Wardwell. Chris also outlined other options for trails to connect population centers on the island and provide improved options for bicycle and foot traffic in Winslow, as well as the Lost Valley trail. Rob also reported on other groups working on trails and interested in talking with us. Chris talked about the possibility of a shared-use path along Fletcher Bay Road. He also presented the idea of Greenways on Winslow from Madison to Grow, and on Grow from Winslow Way to Wyatt and on to the High School.
- Wayne encouraged committee members to read the attachments posted on Navigate Bainbridge, particularly comments regarding roads.
- Chris showed drawings for the first phase of the STO and for the Olympic Drive project
- Patty reported on the Friday meeting on changes to 305 by the Casino. Squeaky Wheels has posted a drawing on their website. A further meeting with Ross is to be scheduled.
