Present: Alyse Nelson, Chair, Demi Allen, Marsha Cutting, John Grinter, Patty Lyman, and Don Willott. Absent: Lief Horwitz. Also attending were COBI Liaison Wayne Roth, Park District Liaison Kirk Robinson and City Engineer Chris Hammer. Also attending were two community members.

1. Map of City-Maintained (and other) Island Trails

Chris displayed an updated comprehensive trail map. Kirk noted recent Park District trail improvements which were missing. Committee members were pleased to have the information. A revised version will be posted on the City's website soon.

2. FY2015 Trail Funding

Chris asked the Committee to consider using \$25,000 budgeted for a postponed Hyla School project to complete the Sportsman Club trail before the end of the year. Although there was strong support for completing the Sportsman Club trail, the Committee preferred to look for another project, including revisiting Hyla School, or to move the funds to FY2016.

3. Non-motorized Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP)/20 Year Priorities

The Committee discussed proposed selection criteria for prioritizing TIP. Criteria will be weighted, using a point system. Several additions and clarifications were suggested. Chris will distribute the revised selection criteria and the current 20-year TIP to the Committee for review before the next meeting.

4. Island-Wide Transportation Plan (IWTP) Review

All nine chapters of the IWTP were reviewed, with particular attention to Non-Motorized System (Chapter 7). There was consensus that the term "multi-modal" should be emphasized in the Introduction as well as throughout the plan. Also discussed were transit access improvements as top priority to address congestion on 305 and updating LOS standards for pedestrians & bicycles.

5. Dana Berg Recognition

Demi asked whether the City might recognize Dana Berg for her many contributions to non-motorized activities. Among the ideas were: Council resolution and a bench or plaque on the STO trail or other NM project. Demi and Wayne will follow up.

6. Public Comment: Robert Dashiell asked about the status of stormwater mitigation on STO trail. Chris explained that the problem has been resolved.

Roy from Vineyard Lane asked about timetable for STO construction. He said that it is difficult to obtain information about the project. Chris said the City website will be updated.
