1. City Engineer Report - Chris Hammer

- **Name Change to Multimodal** - Discussed reasons to change name to be sure we include the breadth of transportation planning. The committee was overall supportive of the idea. We would need to update the resolution that created the committee. However, it could change the dynamic of the committee because we would need to expand the focus. Chris encouraged the group to think about this and we can come back to it. He'll look into the committee charter.
- **STO Visconsi** - Developer has asked to move the STO to the other side of the road. They have a condition of development to build the STO trail along their frontage. They'd like to explore moving it to the other side. Don was supportive of taking advantage of that opportunity due to the recent Park's acquisition. Parks would like to walk through the area with Visconsi. We made a recommendation to move forward with Visconsi on the

East side of 305 at least an equal length to the frontage of their property. Chris will keep Don and Parks in the loop and share designs with them as he gets them.

- **CIP Development & Priorities** - Demi talked about how we need to take our vision document, policy items and making sure our project list and map matches. We discussed the upcoming Planning Commission workshop on transportation element (scheduled for October 28). The planners want the transportation element to be where the goals/policies are located instead of in the IWTP. We'll revisit the IWTP after the comp plan update is underway. We also discussed the need to understand where the land use update is so we know where density may be being directed and we can have that inform the transportation project list or prioritization. Wayne mentioned there is a draft from the Planning Commission for the land use plan. Chris will talk to Jennifer to get us information. We'll try to meet next Monday. Don mentioned funding resources needs to be considered when we think about CIP project development. Chris wants to think about doing a planning study for the 305 corridor.
- 4. **Update - Central Campus Triangle Demonstration Project** - Doug wanted to get a recommendation from NMTAC and then Council endorsement. Wayne will work to find out how to get it on Council agenda for October. Then Doug can coordinate with the School District, Police and others. It would be helpful to have us attend to give public comment. We talked about being flexible with the timing and to be sure to provide enough lead time to get a high level of participation. We also talked about using this to help leverage grant applications for Safe Routes to School applications. We could also use it as an educational process to help build capacity for neighbors to lead their own walk/bike trains.

5. **Comments from the Public**

- o Jim Ewing - He's here as part of the Friends of Rolling Bay group. Valley Road and Sunrise from Winther down to Valley are two walkability issues. How do

they get projects on the CIP list? We talked about being involved in transportation element update, reviewing the existing non-motorized plan, and emailing Chris so it can be sent to our group.

6. **Liaison Report Out** - Wayne Roth - Mentioned that Don will be reappointed as PSRC liaison.
7. **Miscellaneous Items** - John mentioned he attended Go Bainbridge meeting and St. Lucia lighting event is being planned for December. Hyla had a work party on Sunday and the trail is mostly in, although not public, but may be a possibility in the future.
